



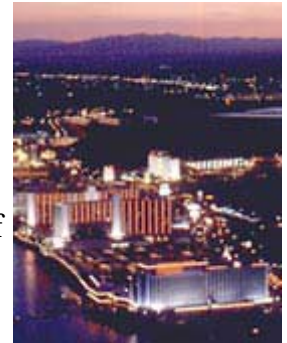
# 2nd Annual Desert Southwest Fire and Life Safety Conference
